Boxes Joined Advent Calendar



- You will need:
- Scan & Cut Machine
 - True Gift of Christmas USB
 - Carnation Glue
 - 300gsm Cardstock

Instructions

How to create an Advent Calender

1. Cut all the files out for the advent calender on the Scan & Cut - as shown on page 1.

2. Take the joined boxes and fold the first section as shown in Figure 1.
- Fold Valleys folds first from the centre and then work outwards to fold the Mountain folds.

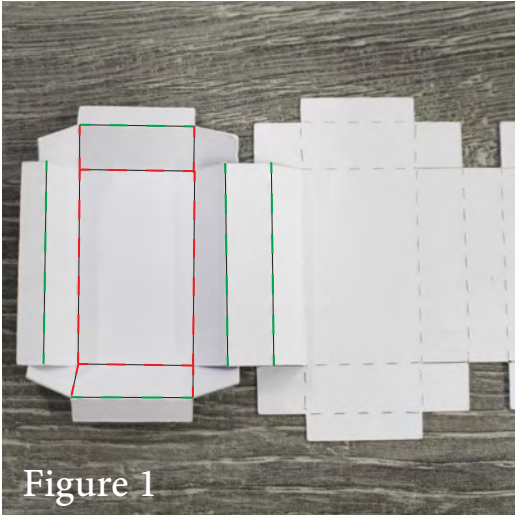

3. With the first box section folded, stick the four tabs to the outer edges to start creating the boxes, as shown in Figure 2.

Repeat the same process with the remaining boxes

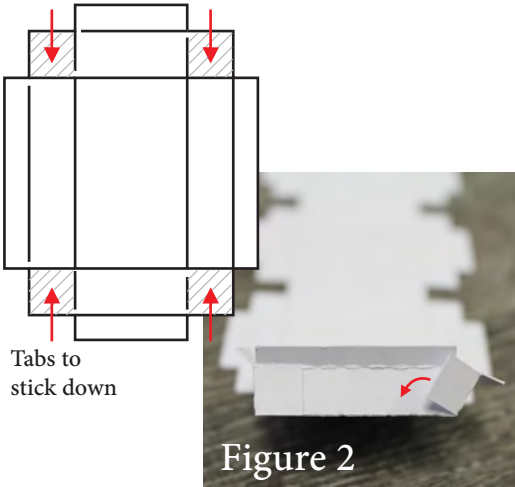

4. You will end up with rows of constructed joined boxes, as shown in Figure 4.

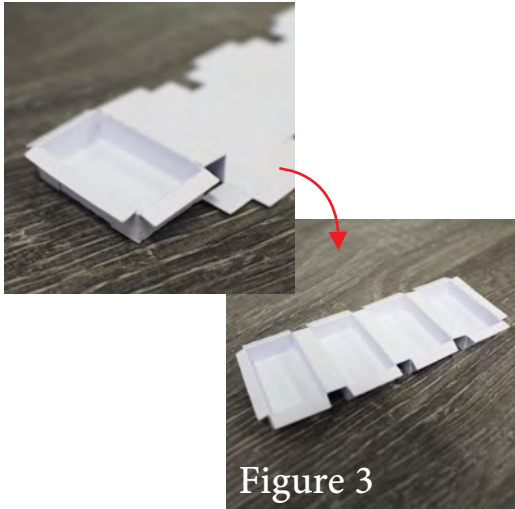

5. With all of the boxes constructed, line up the back of the boxes to the registration cut lines on the back panel and glue these in place.

6. Add your desired treat within the individual boxes to be opened behind each door before gluing the front panel on top.

7. To glue the top panel on, add glue to the remaining tabs of the boxes, indicated in Figure 5.

Take the front panel of the Advent Calendar and align it with the back panel, lightly press down and allow this to dry and set in place.

8. Add the optional frame on the front to finish the calendar, plus your choice of mats and numbers for a personal touch.

You will now have a complete Advent Calendar.
